This ambitious project has transformed Belval into a thriving urban centre that integrates historic industrial heritage with contemporary architecture, as parts of the old industrial site have been retained and uniquely integrated into the new concept. The two remaining blast furnaces not only bear witness to an era long gone, but are also landmarks of New Belval.

The Belval project continues to evolve, attracting investment and becoming one of the cornerstones of urban regeneration and sustainable development in Luxembourg.
